<u>Surgical Evaluation Travel Scholarship</u>	The "Dreams for Danny" Surgical Evaluation Travel Scholarship offers up to \$1,000 in reimbursed travel expenses for eligible families who must travel over 50 miles to a Level 4 epilepsy center for a surgical evaluation. For those who cannot afford to cover costs upfront, we also consider providing a cash card to ease the financial burden.
<u>Parent Support Navigator Program</u>	Through our collaboration with the HOBSCOTCH Institute for Cognitive Health and Well-Being and Parent 2 Parent USA, our parent support navigators are trained in evidence-based peer support practices, managing epilepsy, and the epilepsy surgery journey. All parent supporters are caregivers with lived experience and can help navigate decision-making and other challenges. Languages spoken: English, Spanish, French, Farsi, Hindi, Portuguese.
<u>School Training Education After Pediatric Epilepsy Surgery Facebook Group</u>	If a child has had epilepsy surgery, we provide free training for the school team on the educational impact of the epilepsy surgery (e.g. after hemispheric surgery, the impact of homonymous hemianopia on learning to read.) We also host a private Facebook group, Education After Pediatric Epilepsy Surgery, where parents can exchange ideas with other parents.
<u>Individual Education Plans for Children with Neurological Conditions</u>	A majority of children, even after successful epilepsy surgery, require special education through an individual education plan (known as an IEP.) Our free, self-paced course helps parents and caregivers build an effective IEP for their child.
<u>Family Conferences</u>	Held every two years, our family conferences provide parents, caregivers, and siblings with information and community. Opportunities to participate in onsite research included.
<u>Global Pediatric Epilepsy Surgery Registry</u>	IRB-approved global pediatric epilepsy surgery registry, participation by parent proxy, to capture the developmental trajectory after epilepsy surgery.
<u>Transition to Adulthood</u>	Free, self-paced course about everything a parent needs to know to transition their child post-epilepsy surgery to adulthood.
<u>The (Almost) Everything List</u>	100+ pages of Information about how to make decisions, school, adult life, financial assistance, and family resources.
